CULP has successfully implemented several innovative projects in diverse socio-geographical settings and reached out to 14.78 lakh in about 5500 habitations in eleven districts of Rajasthan during last one and half decade.



PROGRAMS

On Going Programs

ASPIRE PROGRAM

The issue of women's self-reliance is most important as it has been found that the situation of women getting vocational training is really grim in the state. The adolescents and young women in rural society don't have proper career counseling / guidance to manage the skills and use potential for their economic empowerment. As per the CULP survey It was found that only 14% women in the age group of 20-30 years are engaged in some kind of vocational training which is very low and the percentage dips further in case of women aged 15-19 years. The situation of child and women health and hygiene is grimmer in the marginalized communities (minorities and tribal) where CULP works. Thus, a multi-pronged approach was required which should focus on planning, supply chain management, capacity building, behavior change communication, monitoring, review and evaluation, we aim to improve the survival and health of those who need it most, especially women, adolescent girls and young children.

Keeping this in view a formal collaboration was established between CULP and The Desai Foundation Trust in 2021 for implementation of the 'ASPIRE PROGRAM', beginning from one block in Tonk district to scale-up in larger area of more blocks and districts in rural Rajasthan.

Goal

The over-arching goal of the project is to create enabling social environment for Girls and Women to Lead a Dignified and Healthy Life with their full potential. The program activities have specific goal to improve social and economic life in select habitations of rural Rajasthan, and to develop and implement health, hygiene, educational & vocational programs to promote quality of life in underprivileged communities.

Activities in the year

Health & Awareness Camps

The objective of the camps was not only to provide health services but also work to sensitize rural population on good health practices and positive health seeking behaviors. The camps focused on four different components general / specialized care, awareness programs, screening and referral services.

Two health camps were organized in quick succession in Dausa district in the month of December, 2021. One camp was for the women and another one was for children. In the children camp about 250 children from the 20-30 villages of nearby 5 gram Panchayats who had health problems, were examined by Dr. Sunil Agarwal and Dr. Devendra Soni, Pediatricians at Cradle Hospital, Jaipur. In this camp, check-up, counseling and essential medicines were also provided free of cost.



In the health checkup and awareness camp for women, Dr. Madhu Singh, a senior gynecologist from a prestigious hospital in Jaipur examined the patients with gynae

problems whereas Dr. Ajay Jakhar extended his expert consultancy as physician. They both examined the patients allocated to them at the time of registration as per their health issues and need. In total 358 patients were examined by both the doctors. The patients



were also given free medicines as prescribed by the doctors on the spot.

Apart from the health checkup of the patients, the awareness program has been an integral part of the entire health camps. The sessions were conducted with the beneficiaries waiting to be examined by the doctor. They were imparted the information mainly on the issues like; menstrual hygiene, need and ways to keep oneself healthy, healthy food habits etc.

Learning from the three camps, CULP decided to organize Eye, dental and ENT checkup camp along with the women health & checkup camps in Tonk district. For the first time, these kinds of Camps were organized as the



demand for these camps had been received from all corners of the field. Ophthalmologist Dr. Premprakash and Dentist Dr. Ramavatar examined the patients. A large number of patients including women, men and children turned up to get examined for their ailments. In total 198 patients got benefited with the camp. The



overwhelming response was seen especially for the eye checkup since elderly people suffer such ailments and often neglect due to unavailability of specialist doctors in nearby PHCs. With the association of Eye bank Society of Rajasthan the referred patients were assured be given treatment at one of the prominent Eye

Hospital of Jaipur, where cataract and cornea transplant could be taken place as per the condition and the requirement of patient.

Vocational training activities

Skill Training Program has been launched by CULP under ASPIRE project in Dausa and Tonk districts of Rajasthan for training in computer as well as in Sewing to adolescent girls and young women. To open skill training centers, CULP identified such Gram Panchayats, where the population of marginalized communities is in large numbers and women have less opportunity to learn skills. After discussion with team members, field visits and analyzing the survey reports, Gram Panchayat Banasthali, Rajwas and Jhilai were selected initially to open the skill training centers in Tonk District. Same as Gram Panchayat Bhandarej, Jaupada and Khan Bhankri were identified in Dausa



District.

Three skill training centers were inaugurated on December 29, 2021 at Niwai block of the Tonk district. Initially, a computer training center was inaugurated in Rajeev Gandhi Seva Kendra, Banasthali by sarpanch Lakshman

Singh Rajawat. A sewing training center was inaugurated in community hall, Rajwas by Sarpanch Kanaram Jaat and a computer training center was inaugurated in CULP office, Jhilai by Sarpanch Kanta Devi.

A total of 30 girls were enrolled in Computer training center, Banasthali, 30 in computer training center, Jhilai and 20 girls and were enrolled in Sewing training center, Rajwas. All the



trainers were given the modules/syllabus of the respective courses according to the batches of three months. For the course of computer training, basic computer fundamentals were included like introduction to computer, input and output devices,



software and hardware, memory, paint, Microsoft word, Microsoft excel, PowerPoint and internet. 85-90% of trainees attended regular classes. For the course of Sewing

training center, the basics of sewing fundamentals like Paper cutting, measurements, stitching, blouse cutting, simple and designer blouse making, frocks, skirts, tops, various types of sleeves, simple and designer suits, gowns, lehenga and palazzos have been included.

After the successful opening of three skill training centers in Tonk districts, CULP opened two skill training centers (one computer training center and one sewing center) on February 28, 2022 at Dausa district. The sewing training center is located at Khan Bhankri Panchayat and Computer training center at Bhandarej mod of Jaupada Panchayat. One more sewing training center was also inaugurated on March 25, 2022 at Bhandarej Mod.



Till March 31, 2022 CULP has enrolled a total of 165 Beneficiaries at six training centers in two districts out of which two batches of computer training course and one batch of sewing training course have been completed successfully.

Voices from the centers

- "My name is Chandrakala Choudhary, I am 19 years old and living at Rajwas. Due to financial constraints, I could not study after 12th. I had interest in sewing since childhood and I wanted to learn but could not due to lack of opportunities. As soon as I came to know about the opening of sewing center in Rajwas, I immediately got myself registered. Now, after three months of training, I have started sewing cloths for myself and my family members."
- "I am Pinki Saini, 25 years old and living at Jhilai. I was interested in learning computer from the beginning but due to no such facilities in the village, I could not learn. Currently I have been studying in Computer training center Jhilai for three months and I have learned a lot of things like basic fundamentals, MS office, Excel, PowerPoint and internet. By learning the computer my confidence has also increased. Now I am able to perform basic tasks related to computer for myself and family."

HEROES FOR HUMANITY PROGRAM

CULP and Desai Foundation Trust carried out a COVID response program in the two districts of Rajasthan in which they distributed ration kits to the needy families and hygiene kits as an awareness program for prevention of the disease in the month of May-June 2021. It ended up distributing 1200 ration kits



and 1000 hygiene kits, benefitted about 2000 needy families in 45 villages of two districts by a team of two coordinators and 10 volunteers supported by senior management officials of CULP and DFT within a short span of one month. The DFT then decided to merge this COVID response program in to a new and bigger program called 'Heroes for Humanity (HfH)' program which

was initiated in August 2021 in the locations where CULP works.

Key achievements:

1. Immediate financial support to 74 local youths by engaging them as part-time volunteers in the program.
2. Ration distribution to badly affected population in 180 villages (1200 ration kits)
3. Health & Hygiene kits to adolescent girls and young women (776 Hygiene kits)
4. Health awareness sessions with local population especially with women, adolescent girls and boys (2.5 lakhs beneficiaries)

- Conducted Baseline survey (Nov.-Dec.2021) of 30487 HHs in 150 villages of 2 districts with the objective to assess the status of COVID vaccination, education, employment, required legal documents to access the benefit of various social schemes etc.
- IEC material / Posters developed by CULP Field team under the HfH Project which are being used for Health Awareness programs among adolescents and women in the community.

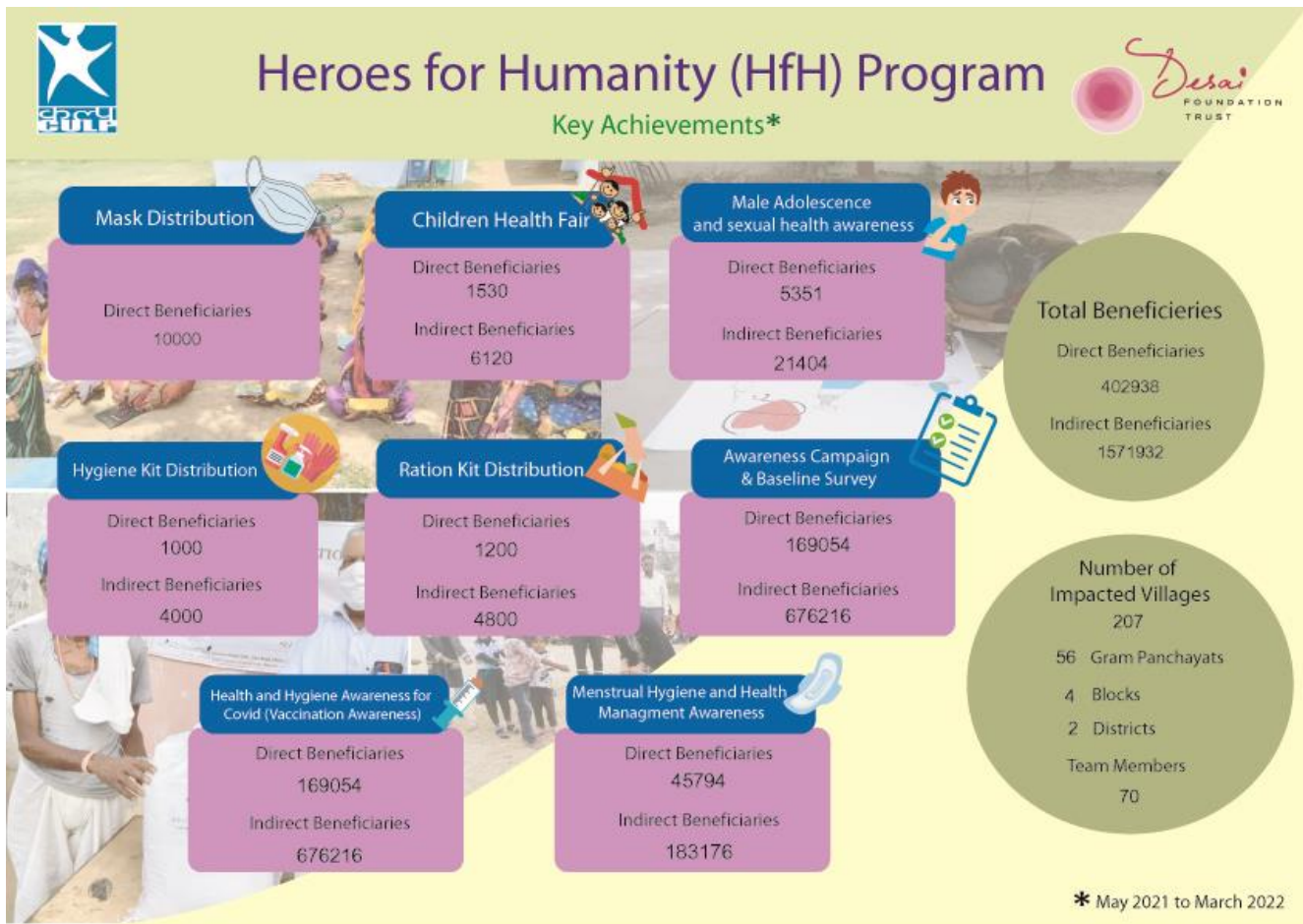

VISUAL PERCEPTION MATTERS PROGRAM

The Visual Perception Matters program is being implemented by CULP in collaboration with 'Triton Hotels and Resorts Pvt. Ltd.' in the select schools of Jaipur city from April 2021. Visual perception refers to information that is perceived through the eyes. In preschool children this perception is still developing, and continues to develop right through primary school. Total number of 500 students from a cross section of schools, including main stream schools, rural schools, schools for the under privileged and development center from Jaipur. The target group of the students will be Students from Classes 1 and 2.

The three-year program aims to create a booklet of activities for the key component areas of visual perceptual skills. Namely:

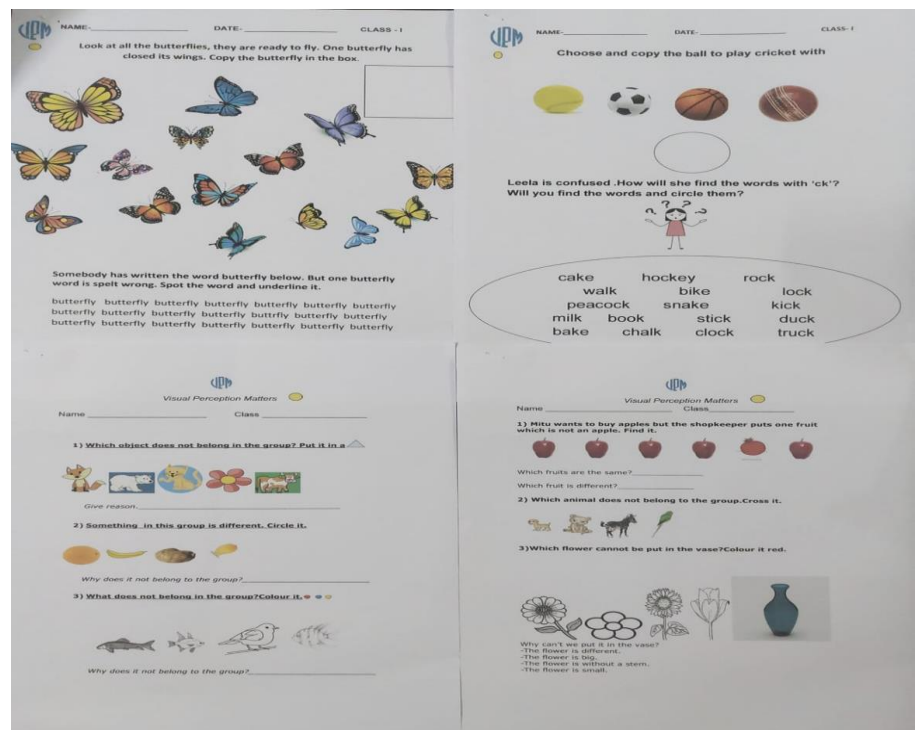
1. Visual Discrimination: The ability to notice detail differences such as shape, size, color, or other dimensional aspects.
2. Form Constancy (Form Discrimination): The ability to perceive positional aspect differences and recognize objects when they are in a different orientation or format.
3. Figure Ground (Foreground-Background Differentiation): The ability to focus on a selected target and screen out or ignore irrelevant images.
4. Visual Closure: The ability to recognize an object, letter or number without seeing the entire object.
5. Visual Sequencing: The ability to see objects in a particular sequential order.
6. Visual Memory: The ability to remember forms (letters) and sequences of forms (words) and recognize them quickly when seen again.

The booklets will consist of grade related activities for each of the three key components of visual perception skills:

Curricular component helps to assess development of cognitive and perception skills, logical thinking and mathematics, language and literacy.

Instructional component helps to observe the comprehension skill of the child in the areas of listening, leading and writing

Organizational component includes observation, following directions, concentration and paying attention, organizational skills and coordinating and managing time.





PEHCHAN PROJECT

The CULP's flagship program is facing financial crisis since April 2020 when EdelGive Project grant was over. A small grant from Polaris Foundation helped to continue the activities for 6 months in FY 2020-21.

- In the FY 2021-22, a small grant from 'Viman Investments – Give Foundation' for running the bridge course centers.
- 3 bridge course centers in Niwai block (Tonk), benefitted 67 girls (dropped out) way back and need to be associated again with the formal school by bridging the learning gaps. These centers were operational for 3 months but due to financial constraints we have put them on hold till we get some long term program grant.



PRAJWALA PROJECT

In order to provide equitable and quality education to the girls in KGBVs, project Prajwala was conceptualized which aims at comprehensive development of KGBVs in which education is one of the central components.

CULP acted as the implementing agency in the Banswara and Pratapgarh districts whereas Bodh Shiksha Samiti acted as a nodal agency for the program in partnership between the state government and the NSE Foundation. The program completed in May 2021. Due to the COVID closure a shift in the strategy was made like:



1. WhatsApp groups were created for those having smart phones and they were taught for 2-3 hours per day for three days in a week. Those who had feature phone were sent the learning material and were instructed on phone.
2. Learning centers in those villages were made operational where no phone facility was available. At these learning centers, the teaching work was done with the group of girls for two days in a week.
3. Profiling of the girls studied at KGBV: The profiling work was also done of the girls studied in the past to assess the changes education brought in their lives after they passed out their 8th class.

COVID RESPONSE PROGRAMS

1. Ration Distribution

Dalyan Foundation with financial help and CULP- Centre for Unfolding Learning Potentials with field support, took initiative to extend their support in the need of the hour as a part of their COVID response. CULP team, present in Tonk and Dausa districts, did a survey of villages and identified most vulnerable population as eligible beneficiaries in 150 villages of 58 Gram Panchayats of four blocks of both the districts and distributed ration kits to the needy families. Owing to the prevailing poverty situation in the villages and presence of a large number of poor people, it was a difficult task to identify the neediest families to provide ration kit for which we determined the basic criteria



like; no earning member in the family or earning member died of COVID, Job lost due to COVID lockdown, prolonged illness of earning member, widows, physically disabled earning member, old aged persons living alone etc.

In Dausa district 800 ration kits were distributed in 75 villages of 33 Gram Panchayats of 3 blocks whereas in Tonk district

800 ration kits were distributed in 75 villages from 25 Gram Panchayats. To carry out the task, identified team of 68 experienced Community Volunteers as field workers in both the districts worked along with two district coordinators one each from the district.

2. VACCINATION DRIVE

It has been felt that there is a need to intensify the vaccination drive in Jaipur urban / peri-urban areas especially in the 10 wards of Greater Nagar Nigam of Vidhyadhar Nagar and Jhotwara Vidhansabha areas. These areas come under Jhotwara Panchayat Samiti. The proposed area covers about 1,12,440 populations and also has habitations where a number of migrant labours, daily wage earners, and people inhabiting slum colonies, construction sites and people engaged in transport services live. The specified area also covers a large part of Jhotwara Industrial Area where a considerable number of industrial labour lives which is required to be 100% vaccinated. The Azim Premji foundation extended its financial and advisory support to take the task further in the proposed area comes under the six UPHCs/UCHCs. The area of six UPHCs /UCHCs was then divided in to three clusters as:

The program was implemented from Dec. 2021 to Feb.2022 further extended till March 2022 which included the recruitment of local community youth as 44 volunteers, 3 field supervisors & one program coordinator; their orientation was done in phased manner and a rapport building with Govt. officials (District Administration (ADM, CM&HO, RCHO, UCHC & UPHCs In-charges), people's representatives (Parshads) and community social activists was also done for taking required permissions (orders by CMHO to UPHCs/UCHCs for providing vaccines). Parshads and local leaders were approached for identifying and manage proper place and



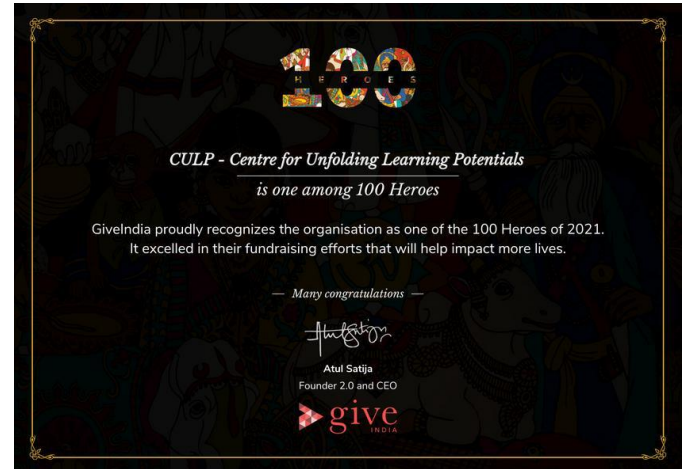
assistance during the vaccination camps.

Major activities carried out during the program:

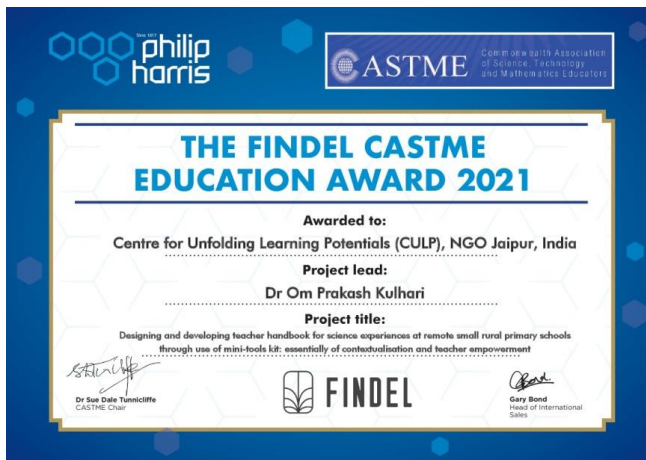
- HHs survey: collected data of 43984 persons in areas divided as per the serving area of UPHCs / UCHCs in 47 habitations data consolidated in excel sheets, cleaned on vaccination.
- 10 Vaccination Camps (Feb. 16 to 25 2022) as per the data in the serving area of 6 UPHCs/UCHCs.
- Vaccinated 2639 persons in camps.
- Achieved 95% vaccination target through awareness drive.
- Post vaccination Camp Survey to assess the status
- Data uploading on VaxIT App (developed by Azimpremji Foundation).

- Youth Leader: Hemant K. Sharma, CULP Area Coordinator (Dausa & Tonk districts) has been selected as a Youth Leader & imparted 3 month training (in-person & virtual) during Dec. 2021 to Feb. 2022 on advocacy issues of Gender equity, education & women empowerment. He has been nominated in a state level Youth Governing Council for advocacy issues by RISE-UP Together, an international organization.



NETWORKING AND ADVOCACY

CULP actively engaged in the following CSOs networks on Policy issues related to Education, Health, Child Marriage, Gender Equity and legal entitlements of the people:

1. Girls Not Brides (GNB) Rajasthan Alliance: a state partnership with GNB Global for ending Child Marriage. The Secretary of CULP co-chairs the Rajasthan chapter.
2. Coalition for Tobacco Control in Rajasthan recently started an advocacy campaign for making the Rajasthan tobacco Free State through effective compliance of the Provisions of COTPA-2003. CULP is one of founding and core group members of the coalition.
3. Jan Swasthya Abhiyan (JSA) Rajasthan which is campaigning for 'Health for All' in the state. The secretary played key role for drafting the memorandum for bringing Free Health Facility for all the people in the state. The state government has prepared the draft bill in this regard which will be tabled in the forthcoming assembly session.
4. Rising Rajasthan Campaign: A network of about 5000 girls from 5 districts (including CULP Project beneficiary girls from Tonk district) demands from the government for Free Education up to grade 12 for all girls and adequate provision of scholarship for the girls of economically vulnerable communities. CULP provides technical support to the network.
5. FORCES Network: A National level CSOs network on rights of children and women for strengthening ICDS Services.
6. National RTE Consortium: advocacy on effective compliance of provisions of RTE Act 2009.

CULP participated in about 11 online and 4 off-line consultation workshops organized by the above mentioned CSOs networks, INGOs, UN Agencies and the government institutions on the issues related to rights of children, women, minorities, tribals, and other marginalized communities at national and state level during the last one year in

which CULP contributed specific suggestions for formulation of recommendations to bring the relevant changes in the policies and programs of the government.

- 6 vocational training centres have been made operational
- Successfully distributed ration kits to 1600 needy families in Tonk and Dausa districts.
- Could be able to raise funds around 8 lakh rupees through Give India platform (Crowd funding) & Rs. 5.00 lakhs through individual donations.
- Recognition of CULP's work at national and International level.

Challenges

- Funding crisis for continuation of CULP's flagship program 'Pehchan' being faced and we are constantly working to sustain.
- Delayed due-diligence process of new project proposals for uncertain time due Covid situation.
- Delayed responses for newly submitted proposals to new potential funding agencies.
- Compliance of norms of the new amendments in government laws and policies which takes too much time and resources.

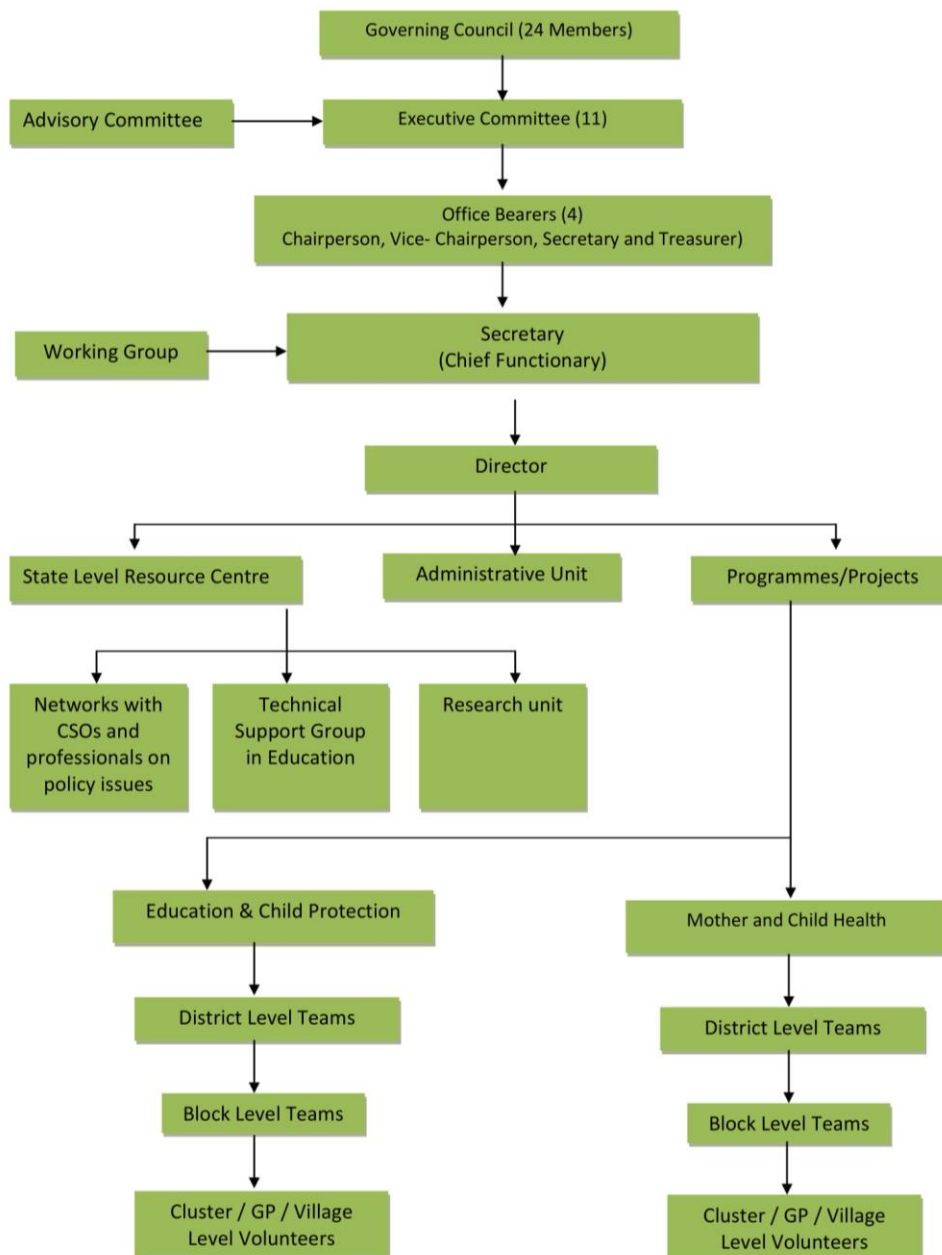
