Menstrual Day Celebration and HFH Felicitation Report

Introduction:

Heroes for Humanity program is being smoothly implemented by CULP in collaboration with Desai Foundation Trust since 10 months in Dausa and Tonk districts of Rajasthan. It is well known that World Menstrual day is celebrated on 28th May every year. An event was organized to celebrate the occasion of World Menstrual day and to felicitate the Heroes for their outstanding efforts so far. It was planned to organize the event on 28th May at Dausa district and on 31st May at Tonk District.

The first event was organized in Dausa on May 28, 2022 on 10 AM at Gram panchayat Ganeshpura of Dausa Cluster. The venue of the event was Meeting Hall, Gram Panchayat Ganeshpura. Similarly the same event was organized in Tonk on May 31, 2022 on 10 AM at Rajeev Gandhi Seva Kendra, Jhilai. Total 118 people have participated at Dausa and 103 people have participated in Tonk district. Heroes of HFH program (CFs and CFHs), skill training beneficiaries, HFH beneficiaries, peoples representatives, stake holders, school teachers, Anganwadi workers CULP officials and DFT executive were present in the event. Mr. Prahlad Meena, Pradhan, Panchayat samiti Dausa and Mr. O.P. Saini sarpanch Ganeshpura chaired the event in Dausa and Mrs. Chandrakala Devi, ex. Pradhan panchayat samiti, Niwai and Mrs. Kanta Devi Sharma, Sarpanch Jhilai were chaired the event in Tonk.



Felicitation Ceremony of Heroes: The whole program was divided in two phases. The first phase of the event was celebrated as felicitation ceremony of Heroes in which following activities were organized:

Background and Key Achievements Sharing:

After welcoming the guests, Heroes and beneficiaries, they all were introduced to CULP and Desai Foundation trust. The background and key achievements of HFH program in different activities like Ration Distribution, Hygiene kit Distribution, Vaccination Awareness, MHM awareness, Male awareness, Baseline Survey etc. and Achievements of ASPIRE program through different activities like Women Health and awareness camps, Children Health Camp, Eye and Dental Health Camp, Computer training centers, Sewing training centers, numbers of beneficiaries etc. were explained in brief. Mr. Sudhir Upadhyay, Director CULP shared the achievements in Dausa and Dr. OP Kulhari, Secretary CULP shared in Tonk.

Success Stories by Heroes and Beneficiaries:

Heroes for Humanity program has been implementing on field for more than 9 months. In these 9 months our heroes have performed several tasks and activities such as Ration kit distribution, Vaccination Awareness, Masks and Hygiene kit distribution, vaccination awareness, baseline survey, MHM and Male awareness, PHHE activities and social protection schemes related survey. By all these activities and working on fields their own abilities have developed. There has also been a change in their mindset and behavior as compared to before. Heroes, Bharat Singh Bairwa, Anchal Tiwari and Maya Gurjar shared their success stories in Dausa and Anjana Jangid, Sayra Bano and Devki Sharma Shared their stories in Tonk.

Some of the beneficiaries, who were get benefitted by either Ration kits or any awareness Programs, came from different villages of project areas, were also participated in the program. They also shared about their family background, situation of COVID and lockdown, how they were helped by HFH. Also they thanked the HFH program and Heroes the way they were helped in the situation of COVID and lockdown.

Felicitation of Heroes:

The Heroes of the HFH program were awarded with certificates for their outstanding work at the fields. The certificates distribution was done by guests (Pradhan and sarpanch) and they appreciated the efforts of heroes for their contribution to make the program successful. All the CFs, DSs and CFHs who have completed 3+ months successfully in HFH program were awarded by certificates. More than 60 heroes (CFs, CFHs and DSs) were felicitated by the certificates in both the districts.

Along with this the trainees who have completed their courses from our skill training centers (Sewing and Computer) were also given certificates. 20 beneficiaries from Sewing center Khan Bhankri, 18 beneficiaries from computer center Bhandarej Mod, 38 Beneficiaries from Sewing Center Rajwas, 22 Beneficiaries from Banasthali were awarded by completion certificates in the event.



Menstrual Day Celebration: The second phase of the event was celebrated as Menstrual day in which the following activities were organized:

Social Media Posts:

The celebration of Menstrual health and hygiene day was being done by heroes for a week. Heroes have designed many slogans related to menstrual health and take pictures/selfies with them. These pictures/selfies were uploaded on social media (Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp status) and shared with relatives, friends or colleagues to generate maximum awareness on the sensitive issue of menstrual hygiene. Male heroes were also uploaded and shared their posts related to menstrual hygiene to support women and adolescents.



Menstrual Health and Hygiene Awareness:

During the event, Antara Mukherjee, Executive DFT shared important information and generated awareness about menstrual Health and hygiene. She explained the issue openly and cleared all the myths and misconceptions people had about menstrual health. For this, she also did a balloon activity with all the heroes and beneficiaries, in which all the myths and misconceptions related to menstrual health were blown up in the form of air. After this, sanitary pads were distributed to all the heroes, guests and beneficiaries present in the event.

Oath ceremony:

All the participants (Heroes, Beneficiaries and guests) were also administered an oath to not believe all the myths and misconceptions related to menstrual health. The oath activity was done in a very interesting way, in which it was written on a big poster that "We take oath that we will not adopt the misconceptions related to menstruation and will also make other people aware about it." After this, in turn, everyone dipped their paws in color and put on the poster to took the oath.
